



## What is CHAMPS?

CHAMPS – which stands for Children Need Amazing Parents – is a policy campaign focused nationally and in states to ensure bright futures for kids in foster care by promoting the highest quality parenting. CHAMPS aims to spur policy change in 25 states over five years, and enhance the public’s understanding about the vital role that foster parents, including kinship caregivers, play in a child’s life – including to provide love and security when birth parents cannot, and to help them achieve permanency through reunification with their birth parents, adoption, or guardianship with relatives.

**New York** is proud to be a state campaign partner to CHAMPS. The CHAMPS NY campaign is co-led by the Schuyler Center for Analysis and Advocacy and Families Together in New York State (FTNYS).

The **Schuyler Center** is a leading statewide policy analysis and advocacy organization working to shape policies to improve health, welfare, and human services for New Yorkers. The Schuyler Center’s work in public policy focuses on strengthening children and families as a long-term investment in the health and well-being of our state. **Families Together in New York State** is a family-run organization that represents thousands of New York State families with children who struggle with social, emotional, and behavioral challenges – resulting in their interaction with many complex systems, including mental health, substance abuse, juvenile justice, special education, and child welfare.

**CHAMPS** builds on research that shows that loving, supportive families – birth, kin, foster or adoptive – are critical to the healthy development of all children. By bringing together research, policy solutions and key stakeholders, CHAMPS New York seeks to be a valued partner and information source to decision makers across the state who are looking for evidence-based policy approaches on supporting and strengthening families for children and youth in foster care.

## Why Focus Policy Efforts on Quality Foster Parenting and Kinship Caregiving?

Children need and do best in families. Foster parents and kinship caregivers are key to helping children heal, grow and thrive when their biological parents are unable to do so.

We know what works to achieve quality caregiving; many approaches are no- or low-cost solutions. By acting now to support foster parents and kinship caregivers, more children will:

- Be safe and healthy,
- Experience greater academic success,
- Stay connected to their siblings,
- Have more stable lives, and
- Leave foster care for a permanent family through safe reunification with birth families, guardianship with relatives, or through adoption.

## CHAMPS New York

*CHAMPS NY is a statewide group of advocates and providers working to advance state policies and practices that ensure that, in those instances when foster care is necessary, children are placed into family-based settings whenever possible, and that their caregivers are supported so that children experience the best possible permanency and wellbeing outcomes.*

*CHAMPS NY is dedicated to advancing policy and practice change that helps to ensure that when children are unable to remain safely with their birth parents, they are placed in the most appropriate setting. **By 2021, in each New York State County, CHAMPS NY seeks to increase by at least 15% the percentage of children in foster care residing in well-supported family-based care, with a comparable reduction of the percentage of children in group homes.***

*CHAMPS New York activities include:*

- *Public events to raise awareness*
- *Media outreach to communicate about the vital importance of stable, supportive caregiving to children's health, development, education and permanency*
- *Research and policy advocacy to promote data-driven, innovative policy approaches*
- *Technical assistance to public and private agencies and legislators seeking solutions*
